General Election 2024 - The Prime Minister has called a general election for Thursday, 4 July. There is a range of information and guidance on key issues of importance to us, as Catholics, to help inform how we vote. Gospel values inform how we look at the world as Christians. These values can also offer a different way of looking at politics, a way that puts the common good before self-interest. The Catholic Bishops' Conference has guidance on issues such as criminal justice, poverty, migration, education, international relations, life issues and the environment

Willoughby Dampier RIP: His Funeral Service was conducted by Fr Ralph Candy, the Parish Priest of the Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Paignton, and held in the Co-op Funeralcare Chapel in Paignton. Willoughby's coffin was bedecked with a splendid floral spray together with a small abundance of chocolates, which Willoughby had a bit of a passion for.

A fine and well composed Order of Service had been prepared by Fr Candy who during the Service gave a splendid address. It was pleasing also to recognise the evident warmth displayed by Fr Candy towards Willoughby from getting to know him in the latter stages of his life while visiting the Nursing Home in Paignton where Willoughby resided.

Together with Ginny, the best possible eulogy was delivered in the light of the limited information that we held on Willoughby and the life that he had led. With Fr Candy's help and co-operation it is likely that Willoughby's ashes will in due course be returned to the Yelverton area for final resting'. (Thanks to Paul Ring)
