School Transport grants for the academic year 2024-

25— The Diocese of Plymouth is now taking applications from parents/guardians wishing to apply for grants for transport to a Catholic or Catholic/CofE school situated in the Diocese of Plymouth. Applications for the academic year 2024-5 must be submitted in writing and be signed by the Parish Priest. Families will be notified at the start of the Autumn term if their application has been successful. There are limited funds and not all applications may be successful.

You can obtain an application form from the parish office. The deadline for returning the forms to Fr Cyriacus is Sunday 21st July 2024.

The **Annual Naval Mass** will take place on Sunday, 21st July, in the Cathedral Church of St Mary & St Boniface, Plymouth, at 10.00 am with Bishop Paul Mason, the Bishop of the Forces, as Principal Celebrant. The dress for serving personnel is Number 1 uniform with medals and veterans are encouraged to wear their medals. The Mass will be followed by a drinks reception hosted by the Royal Navy Catholic Chaplaincy – all welcome!

The Fourth World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly will take place on Sunday 28th July and is themed "*Do not cast me off in my old age*", (cf. Psalm 71:9).
